She attained mythical stature long ago and enchants us to this day, especially in the 'Sissi' films at Christmastime. She spent her childhood summers on Lake Starnberg and later, as Empress, a lot of time in the area.

But what tied her to this region? What was her childhood like? How was her everyday life influenced by the social norms of her time? How did she spend her time here?


